




Wednesday was the first visit to St Paul's by our new School Improvement Officer from Wokingham Borough Council and he was very impressed by all he saw, particularly:

Earrings

Our responsibility as a school should be to enable as many children as possible to participate in physical activity and school sport and we would like to clarify school policy on the wearing of earrings. Earrings present a hazard to both the wearer and other children taking part in sports activities.

Regardless of the practice in other schools, our policy is based on the guidance for schools from the Association of Physical Education (afPE) and is to prevent injury to the wearer or others:

- Children are not permitted to wear jewellery, including pierced earrings, during PE lessons.
- We ask that earrings are left at home on PE days;
- Teachers are not allowed to take out or replace children's earrings for a pupil;
- Children are responsible for their own earrings if they remove them whilst at school;
- Taping of earrings is not allowed as The Association for Physical Education (afPE) advice is that the taping of earrings 'creates a perception of safety and is not recommended'. There have been several incidences within the local authority where children's ears have been injured from earrings being ripped out of ear lobes from under the tape.

If a child has their ears pierced and are unable to remove their earrings, they will not be permitted to take part in the practical aspect of PE lessons for six weeks. During this period, they will be able to take on the role of umpire, referee or coach, where appropriate.

The fundamental reason not to wear earrings (or any jewellery) is that it can lead to injury for the wearer and for others in the class. Wearing earrings can result in tearing of the ear lobe and the post of the earring puncturing the neck.

If asked for advice about ear piercing, we always advise wait until the start of the summer holidays, to give piercings the opportunity to heal in time for the new academic year.

Aurora Borealis over Wokingham!




Many of our school family were very excited to see the spectacular display of the Northern Lights over Wokingham last night!



Writing the Nested Narrative Story with Eva Wong Nava - Wokingham Library - Sunday 20th October 11:30am


This talk will focus on writing a story within a story, and why this literary device is useful for structuring your children's story.

We welcomed 6S into the woodland on Monday afternoon. They worked collaboratively to produce some exceptional pieces of ground art.

Our afternoon groups have been busy this week: planting cauliflower and broccoli into our allotment and learning how to light the fire using the flint and steels. On Thursday afternoon, to recognise World Mental Health Day, the children gathered yellow leaves from the woodland floor and created some wreaths which they chose to hang on our gateway to the woodland to remind us all check in on our mental health and those around us.





A special mention to some of our Y6 pupils who took on some maintenance work in the woodland this week. They had noticed some trees that had been blown down in a storm earlier in the year and worked tirelessly and collaboratively to safely cut down the trees and get them into sizable pieces to use on our fire.
