Latin Comes to St Paul's



Maximum Classics


From the start of this term, all of our pupils will study Latin.

Latin is the next logical step after phonics where children start encountering the Latin half of English. 50% of all English words derive from Latin along with 80-90% of polysyllabic words.

Research findings suggest that there is a strong positive correlation between the learning of Latin and the development of literacy skills at KS2.

Latin is the best preparation for learning any language. To study Latin is to study six languages at once: French, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese and Romanian (The five Romanian languages) which derived and evolved from Latin. About 90% of the vocabulary of these languages comes from Latin.

Latin also provides the root words of not one, not half but *all* of the modern sciences and is the language of the law, government, logic and theology.



Pulmonary: Refers to the lungs and comes from the Latin word <u>pulmonarius</u>, from <u>pulmo, pulmon</u> - lung We will be adapting the Maximum Classics: Literacy through Latin course to go alongside our new foundation curriculum. The first unit was trialled on Year 6 in the Summer Term and this is what they had to say:

"There are no cons- only pros! I have enjoyed the topic because it has taught us the history of the English language and it can come in very useful for when we are trying to figure out what new words mean." – David
