## Vision

At St. Paul's our vision is to ensure that all pupils leave primary school with the knowledge, skills and motivation to help them lead a healthy, active lifestyle and to continue to participate in physical activity in sport.

## Key Aims

- To continue to improve levels of aerobic fitness for all children
- To encourage all children to enjoy PE and chose to participate in physical activity at play and after-school
- To provide additional opportunities for children to participate in organised sporting activities against pupils from other schools
- To increase level of performance of teams representing the school

## Evaluation of the Year 2020 - 2021

2020/2021 was very much a continuation of the previous year due to the impact of Covid-19. We had a second and third lockdown to contend with and due to the restrictions put in place there were no in internal or external cross school fixtures/events. PE & Games sessions were adapted to meet government guidance regarding shared use of equipment, with each class having their own allocated resources for much of the year. The pool remained closed during this academic year, due to Covid-19 restrictions. All pupils in school participate in 'run the world' and those who were not eligible to attend school during lockdown were set a physical challenge each day. Classes met on MS Teams at the end of each day, focusing on relaxation, mindfulness and meditation to support the emotional wellbeing and mental health of all of our pupils.
