#### **Road Safety**

Whether you are a driver or pedestrian, please take a good look at your surroundings to ensure that it is clear to walk safely near parked cars, or reverse your vehicle.

#### Relationships Education at St Paul's

Children and young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world and living their lives seamlessly on and offline. This presents many positive and exciting opportunities, but also challenges and risks. In this environment, children and young people need to know how to be safe and healthy, and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way.

Last year, the government made Relationships Education and Health Education compulsory in all primary schools in England and schools have a duty to have implemented this curriculum by summer 2021. The guiding principles are that the compulsory subject content must be age and developmentally appropriate and taught in a sensitive and inclusive way, with respect to backgrounds and beliefs of pupils and parents, and always with the aim of providing pupils with the knowledge they need of the law. Teaching about mental wellbeing is also central to these subjects.

Schools retain the freedom to determine their curriculum within the bounds of the guidance, including whether or not to teach human reproduction. This is something that has always formed a part of the curriculum at St Paul's, with lessons taking part in the upper school, usually Year 5.

We would like to invite parents to join a working party of staff, governors and parents to help us to develop our new Relationships Policy and curriculum. We are looking for two parents per year group to join staff and governors on this working party. ## COVID-19 Related Pupil Absence - A quick reference guide for parents
