Welcome back, everyone, and a very Happy New Year!

The next few weeks will be a challenge for every member of our school family but by following the rules, we are helping to keep others safe and alleviating some of the pressure on NHS workers risking their lives to save others.

Remote Learning

What a week it has been – definitely not the one we were expecting or hoping for. However, with your help, the children have been magnificent, taking remote learning in their stride. We could not be prouder of our pupils, parents and staff for their efforts over the last four days and by this morning, 353 out of 375 pupils had been present online, most of whom had attended daily live lessons and class drop-ins.

This week, we loaned a number of laptops to families that do not have a device and we have also delivered Data SIM cards to families relying on phone data for school work. Pupils without access to a fixed broadband connection, may be eligible for a free mobile data increase from their provider as the DfE has partnered with mobile providers including EE, 3, Tesco Mobile, Smarty, Sky Mobile, Virgin Mobile on the move, and BT. Pupil Premium pupils without access to a fixed broadband connection, may be eligible for support with a 4G wireless router. We Can Help



If you have had a change in circumstances or are experiencing financial difficulties, please contact us as we are keen to support any family experiencing difficulty in any way we can. As an agent of the Wokingham Food Bank, we are also able to make referrals for families for food parcels and winter fuel top ups and we can help with clothing and equipment. All enquiries are dealt with sensitively and in the strictest confidence.

If you need pens, pencils or paper so your child can complete home learning, get in touch and we will arrange a doorstep delivery the same day.

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Your child may be eligible for free school meals funding and Mrs Lander will be happy to advise and support you with the completion of an application. If eligible, we will register you for the Free School Meals Voucher Scheme which is £15 per child per week.

You may be able to claim if you are in receipt of:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less);
- Income support;
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance;
- Income-related employment and support allowance;
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit;
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less.
