# COVID-19 Related Pupil Absence - A quick reference guide for parents

What to do if	Action needed	Return to school when
<ul> <li>My child has 1 or more of COVID-19 symptoms:</li> <li>HIGH TEMPERATURE – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back and more than 37.6° in children;</li> <li>A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH – this means coughing a lot more than usual in an hour, or 3 or more coughing episode in 24 hours;</li> <li>A LOSS OR CHANGE TO YOUR SENSE OF SMELL OR TASTE – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything.</li> </ul>	DO NOT BRING YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL  Contact the school office to inform us by 8.30am 0118 978 5219 or absence@stpauls.wokingham.sch.uk  Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days  Book a test within the first 5 days of symptoms: https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test or call 111  Contact the school office immediately you receive the test result	Either:  The test comes back negative Or  The test comes back positive and 10 days have passed since test
