Performances and events in 2023 – 24

Universal Voices have been busy performing around Reading this year.





We held our very popular annual Christmas Quiz and party Here's the wrap the parcel game in action.

We were delighted to join the Berkshire County Choirs in a joint concert at the University Great Hall on 23.3.24, where we performed *Everyday Wonders: The Girl from* Aleppo, by Cecilia Macdowall. This piece tells the extraordinary story of Nujeen Mustafa, a Kurdish teenager with cerebral palsy forced by war to flee her home and embark on an arduous journey with her sister from Syria to Europe. The cantata tells Nujeen's story through chorales, rhythmic spoken sections, body percussion, and a solo violin part infused with Middle Eastern flavours. The prevailing mood of Nujeen's story is embodied by the final line of a chorale that bookends this unique concert work: 'singing the song of life itself.'

Universal Voices also performed a mini-opera in this concert, *The Moonrakers* by Malcolm Williamson. Set on the south west tip of Cornwall, the opera told the story of some very clever smugglers and very stupid soldiers who could not see the skullduggery going on under their very noses. The children acted out the music with drama and actions justly receiving very warm applause from the audience for their excellent singing.
