It has been another fabulous week of learning, both at home and at school, with the children continuing to submit lots of examples of excellent work. In the same way we would normally check on the safety of a child absent from school, we will continue to contact parents about any child not regularly seen online. Thank you to those of you who have used the year group mailboxes to advise about medical appointments and when children will not be online - it stops us from worrying about them and making a phone call home! The vast majority of our staff are parents, many of whom are working from home and supporting their own children with remote education, so we completely understand the challenges that this brings and would like to thank you for all that you are doing to help with school work.



It is a worrying time for us at the moment as some of our staff are currently unwell and a number of have tested positive for Covid-19. We are at the maximum in terms of the staff we have available and are working hard to maintain excellent online provision and run our Keyworker School. Rest assured, we have no intention of reducing the amount of teaching we currently have in place or reducing the number of catch-ups each week. We believe that they are vital to our pupils' ongoing progress and wellbeing. Any adjustments will be in the event that your child's teacher is unwell and, in this case, a colleague from a parallel class will upload your child's daily timetable and once they have finished teaching their own Maths and English lesson, they will make their lesson videos available. Your child should still complete and submit their work each day, which their own teacher will respond to once they are well enough to return to work.

As you may already be aware, we are currently without our Deputy Head, Ms Edwards. Mrs Wilson, her job share partner, has kindly rearranged all of her existing commitments and stepped in to support the children in 6N. Our very best wishes go to Ms Edwards and to all of our staff who are currently unable to be with us due to ill health. We wish them all a speedy recovery.

Access to devices



A wonderful thing happened on Wednesday evening! Miss Gilder arrived at school, carrying three brand new laptops, kindly paid for and donated by her dad who had heard of our efforts in trying to support our families in accessing remote learning and wanted to help us in a way that would directly benefit pupils. We cannot thank him enough for his very generous gift and for thinking of our school family at this time. We will certainly be putting them to good use and aim to have them set up and delivered to pupils by the end of the week.

We have been working really hard to support any family who indicated in our IT survey that their child did not have access to a device to complete home learning and/or access to the internet. If you did not manage to complete the survey and this applies to your child, please ring us straight away on 0118 978 5219 as we can provide access to both.

We are now beginning to work our way through the survey results again, this time contacting families who indicated one device is shared by all household members. Where we know there are siblings both attending St Paul's, we will prioritise these families first for a device. Following this, we will continue to identify families in priority order, loaning laptops until we run out.

Safeguarding



In every year group, we teach online safety as part of our Computing Curriculum, including the importance of leaving a positive digital footprint. Our safeguarding arrangements and protocols prevent any child using a school device to access social media or platforms containing age inappropriate content. Mobile phones are turned off at the gate and remain in the care of the teacher until the end of the day, when they are returned to pupils as they leave.

We actively teach of the dangers of uploading comments without thinking and that once something unkind or thoughtless has been posted, it is impossible to limit how widely it is shared. We also make the children aware that this is true for adults and that there are regularly cases in the news where individuals have got themselves into great difficulty, or worse, by posting things online that they would never dream of saying if they found themselves face to face with the person they are disrespecting.

On Thursday, in Jack's live PE lesson on You Tube for the children of Walter and St Paul's, an inappropriate message was posted by someone remotely. Although it was quickly removed, and the matter fully investigated, it has caused considerable and unnecessary hurt and upset. Any future PE lessons will be pre-recorded videos.
