Can you think of other books you have read which are like this one? How are they alike?

Why has the author chosen this setting?

How does the author try to influence what you think of this character?

What is the purpose of this paragraph? (e.g to move things on)

What question would you like to ask the author of this book?

What can you tell about what the author thinks?

Does the article/story try to get you to care about anything or anyone?

Who is this writing for?

What is it trying to persuade the reader to do?

I can talk about how the writing is related to social, historical or cultural tradition

Why do you think this story was written?

Do you know any other stories like this?

What does this story make you think about?

What do you think the message of this story is?

When and where is this story set?

How is the hero/heroine similar to others you have read about?

Does the story remind you of anything that has ever happened to you?

What is different in the story to how things are now? Does the story have any familiar patterns? E.g. structure, imagery etc.

Questions to use when reading with your child

The questions reflect the way books are discussed in school and will help your child gain a deeper understanding of the texts they share with you.
