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PE & Games

We have had a number of queries regarding arrangements for PE and Games. PE kit for all pupils is a plain white round necked t-shirt and navy blue shorts. For outdoor games, the children are permitted to wear a plain navy or black tracksuit. Football Team shirts, whilst very popular, are not school kit and therefore not allowed. For swimming lessons, a one piece costume, swimming hat and towel are required. The children are welcome to wear goggles.

Break Time Snacks

We encourage the children to bring in a healthy snack for morning break – fruit, vegetable sticks, dried fruit and cereal bars are all suitable items. Crisps, chocolate, biscuits and other sugary snacks are not allowed.

We have a number of pupils with acute allergies and for safety reasons, we do not permit any items containing nuts. Please check packaging carefully when choosing items for lunch boxes and break time snacks!

Homework

Over the last year, we have reviewed the impact on pupil progress of the types of homework we set. With less than 40% of pupils regularly completing the tasks and no evidence that some of the types of work completed have a positive or sustained impact on learning, we turned to the available evidence from a range of studies on homework, carried out in this country and further afield, to establish a means of moving forward in this area.

As reading is the vehicle by which pupils access all subjects within the curriculum, much of the homework we give, going forward, will relate to this key area. By the time pupils leave our school, we want them to be skilled, competent readers, whose comprehension skills and knowledge of vocabulary matches their ability to decode words on a page.

Homework tasks will also focus on the development of instant recall of the multiplication tables and their associated division facts, as well as competence in their application in a range of contexts. Our final focus will be on spelling patterns. This change in emphasis will support our work in ensuring that every child leaves our school as a successful learner, well equipped for the challenges of the secondary curriculum.

As part of this work, we will be holding a Reading Information Evening on Thursday 20th September and we would hope that you will be able to join us. This evening is aimed at the parents of every child, including those of pupils who might consider themselves to be 'free readers'. The evening will be packed with advice regarding how you can work alongside the school to continue to support your child in developing their reading skills, whatever the level of books they currently read. It will also be an opportunity to introduce the new Reading Journals we have invested in for each child. This event will be held in the main hall and is for parents only. Car parking will be available from 6.00pm and entrance to the event will be via the doors from the playground, not the main entrance. We look forward to seeing you there.

Crossing Patroller

The good news is that our Crossing Patroller, Diane Burch, is still in post for the time being. We are hopeful that the response from all three schools, the parents, and children, has resulted in the decision to replace this service with a permanent crossing to be reconsidered. We will update you when we hear more.
