### Message for parents considered critical workers

Government advice is that, wherever possible, children of critical workers should remain at home. Last week, Wokingham Borough Council wrote to all Keyworker parents advising of this fact. During the last Lockdown, we averaged 15 pupils attending Keyworker School each day. This time, we have 70 children on our register and have between 55 to 60 in school most days. The provision for the children in school is exactly the same as that for the children learning remotely. They access the same live lessons via MS Teams and complete the same assignments.
