Dear Parents,

Thank you to everyone who is adhering to the restrictions we have in place to ensure the safety of our school community. Your child arriving with everything they need for the day, is helping ensure that only essential visitors and staff come into the building. As the weather is becoming much chillier, please ensure that your child brings a coat to school with them every day. This morning, we had lots of children complaining about being cold because they had left their coats at home!

We must all be mindful that one of the biggest risks to us all at the moment is adult-to-adult contact. You can help reduce the risks to your safety and that of others by waiting on the field until it is time for your child's time slot. We appreciate that everyone is keen to pick up and leave quickly at the end of the day but it is disconcerting to see the number of parents who in their haste to collect their child, walk within just a few centimetres of other adults. For your safety, we strongly urge you to leave a 2m gap between you and the next parent, regardless of how well you know them. This is true with regards to our staff too - a number of parents have walked right up to teachers to speak to them at the end of the day and staff have had to back away from them to maintain a safe distance. Please do not put them at risk or take offence if they ask you to keep your distance. Our aim is to keep every member of our school community safe and that our school remains open to all pupils - we will only achieve this with your help.

We are required to report our COVID related absences to Wokingham Borough Council and in addition, maintain our own records, as well as submitting attendance data to the Department of Education each day. This helps enable the local authority and the DfE to understand the extent and type of Covid related absences from schools. Please remember, if your child develops a new, persistent cough or has a high temperature 37.8 degrees or above, or loses their sense of taste or smell, it is not safe to send them to school and they must isolate for 10 days or be tested for Covid-19. Pupils are able to return once a negative test result has been confirmed. Due to the very high number of queries regarding absence due to illness, we have put together a Quick Reference Guide for Parents at the end of today's Newsletter, which will hopefully answer all of your queries. In the Covid-19 area of our website, you will find this document and a range of information about the arrangements currently in place at school. We have had quite a few parents ask about whether or not we expect adults coming into the playground to wear masks. This is not something that we are able to enforce but anything that helps keep you safe is something we would wholeheartedly encourage.

We have had a number of enquiries about school events such as class assemblies and the Christmas Fair. There are currently no whole school events planned for the foreseeable future, but we will update you if government guidance for schools suggests that it is safe to reinstate such gatherings.

Finally, and most importantly, whilst the 'norm' may not be the one that we are used to, it feels as if the heart is well and truly back in our school. Our fabulous pupils and tremendously hard-working staff team are making the very best of every learning opportunity, despite the unusual circumstances in which we find ourselves!

Bag2School – Thursday 8th October






COVID-19 Related Pupil Absence - A quick reference guide for parents
