Headteacher's Message

Dear St Paul's Families.



We have had another brilliant few days with our remarkable children working their socks off to get back into the swing of a new term jam packed with learning. We are very proud of their efforts so far and on Wednesday, we had the opportunity to share examples of work from across the school with our Strategic Education Partner, Majid Ali, as part of a Writing Review. It was an extremely positive

morning where we shared planning, children's books, visited lessons and spoke with pupils and teaching staff. Majid was extremely impressed with the quality of teaching and of the high standard of writing the children produce - well done everyone, particularly Mrs Dwyer and Mrs Armstrong, our Writing Subject Leaders.

Punctuality and eradicating poor attendance is crucial for any school and where problems such as this are persistent, they are reviewed by the Education Welfare Service as part of their monitoring of our registers. Thank you to all those parents who ensure their child arrives on time and to those families who have made a concerted effort to improve their



child's punctuality this term. In the first four days back, we had over 60 pupils arrive late but this is steadily reducing, with only 5 children signing in after 8.40am this morning. Arriving on time ensures a calm, orderly start to the day and avoids lost learning and as traffic congestion is a long standing issue in the area, please allow extra time if you have no choice but to travel to school by car.



The depths of winter can feel like they will last forever, but Spring is definitely just around the corner as the weather becomes milder and the mornings and evenings are slowly becoming lighter. Whatever you get up to, enjoy your weekend, everyone!

Forest School

We started the new year off with a chilly afternoon in the woods with 6S. They impressed us with their enthusiasm, determination, teamwork and resilience while making small fires. During our reflection, we talked about how they could transfer these skills back into the classroom.

Our new afternoon groups met for the first time this week. After going through our rules, we discussed how we would need to assess the risks depending on the weather conditions. The children decided that if it was an icy day we may need to avoid tree climbing as branches could be slippery.

The children took part in an activity that involved using either a reef knot or clove hitch, as well as square lashings. Their results were fabulous and it was great to see the children helping each other out and providing encouragement.

Our reflection was centred around blessings and we talked about who or what we were grateful for that day. Many spoke about the nature around them: the trees, leaves and creatures. Others spoke about family and friends. We are looking forward to the adventures that lie ahead for these groups this term.

Pupils will need to bring suitable warm clothing with them on their Forest School day e.g. track suit bottoms, hoodie, T shirt and trainers. Shorts and skirts are unsuitable for the woodland area.

On indoor PE days, pupils should come to school in uniform, bringing their kit with them to change into.

Outdoor Games

All classes have Games on Thursdays. Pupils should come to school dressed in PE kit (navy or black shorts or tracksuit, plain white t-shirt). Games lessons take place every week in all but the most extreme weather and, therefore, we ask that pupils bring a gloves, scarves and hats if the weather is cold alongside their school uniform, in case they have to change into dry clothes.

Free School Meals/Pupil Premium

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children. Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.

You can remove them at any time by amending the flag to 'No'. If there are any eligible children who now require milk but do not appear on your account, just add their details to our usual registration spreadsheet (download a copy here), enter a 'Y' in the 'SPS' column and submit it to us at https://www.coolmilk.com/upload.
