We have planted pumpkin, radish and carrot seeds, along with some runner bean plants that were also been donated to us.



The pond area is a favourite place for many of our children. They enjoy observing the nature and wildlife that it provides and follow our "respecting the nature" rule when they catch newts, water boatmen and pond snails.
