Uniform & School Shoes

St David

St David is the patron saint of Wales and he is celebrated on the 1st March. Welsh people often mark this day by wearing one or both of Wales' national emblems - a daffodil and a leek. Special concerts and parades are usually held in his honour.



David - or Dewi Sant in Welsh - was born on the south-west coast of Wales, near to where the city of St David's is today. He is believed to have been born some time in between 462 and 515 AD and there are many stories about miracles happening around him.

His last words to his followers are thought to have been: "Be joyful, keep the faith and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do." The phrase gwenwch y pethau bychain mewn bywyd - 'Do the little things in life' - is still a well-known phrase used today.

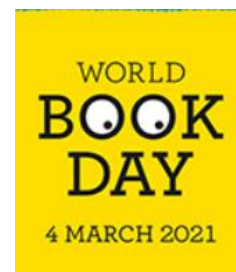


We were also so impressed by the efforts of sister and brother, Amelia, 3B and Jasper, 5P, that we also included them as winners for a joint prize.

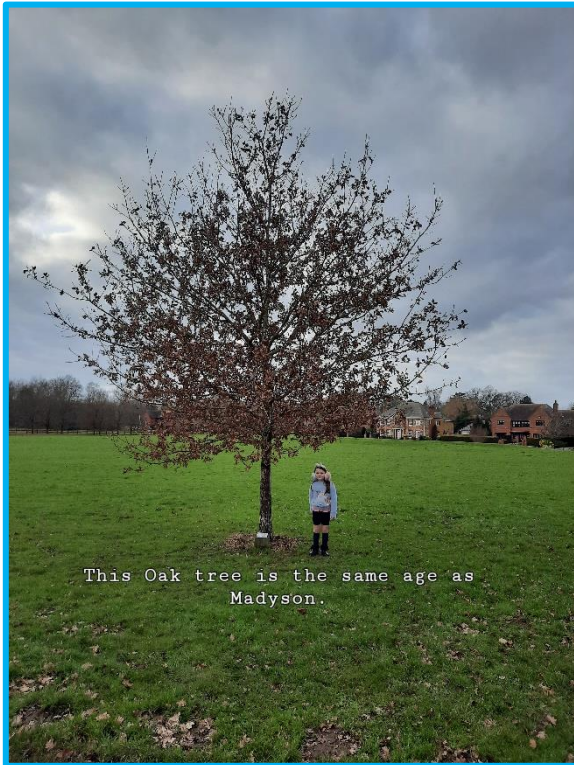
Stripey Zebra

I love to roll in mud and water, I'm stripey not spotted.

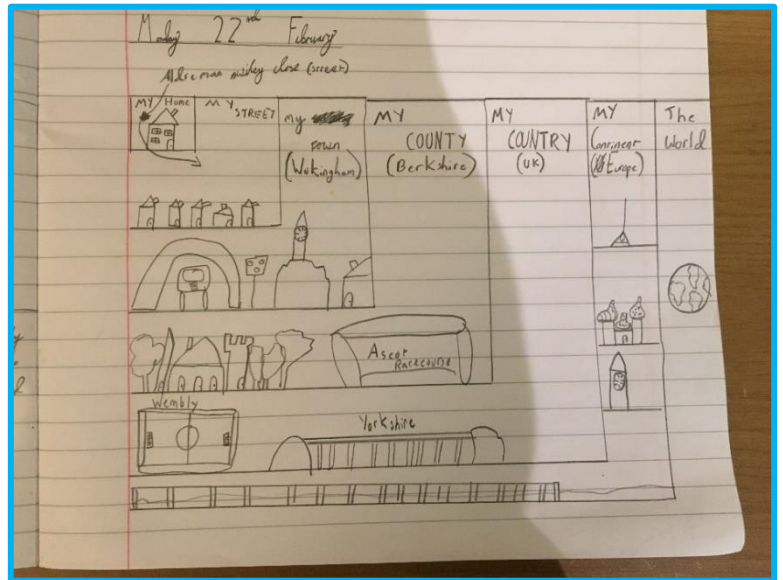
I'll never be a pet zebra, or people ride on my back;

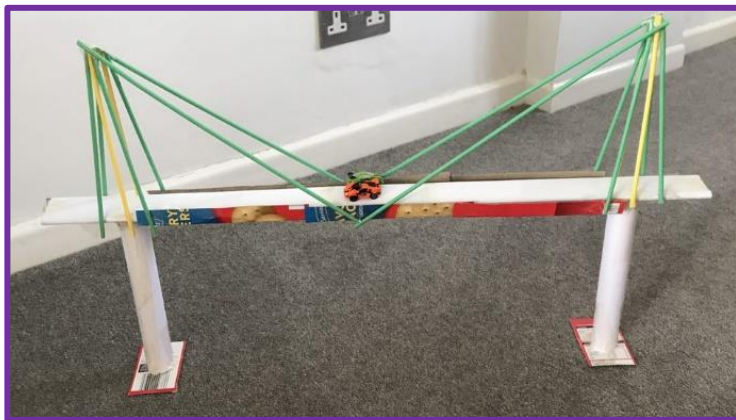
English 25/02/21

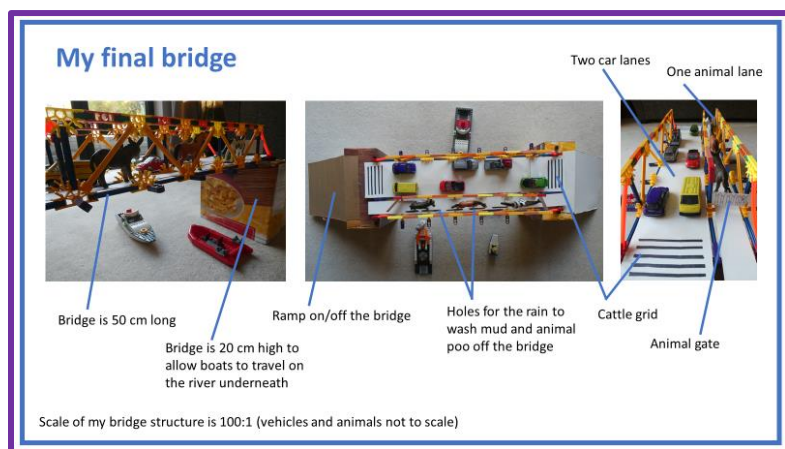
