Dropping off before school

A number of children are being dropped off/are arriving in the morning some considerable time before the doors open. Some are being are left on the playground as early as 8:15am and are then unsupervised until 8:40am when school opens. Children should not be left unattended by an adult before 8.30 unless attending an early morning club.

Pupil Safety

The yellow zig zags may seem like a convenient place to drop pupils but according to the Highway Code, it is illegal to park here, wait or even stop momentarily to drop off or pick up passengers.

It is not a safe place to drop children AT ANY TIME, particularly after the gates have closed as this means that children are then forced to walk alone round to the Oxford Road entrance of school and then navigate the car park which is often busy with traffic.

We would encourage parents to put the safety of children above all else, even on those days when they are running late.

Forgotten Items

Just got home and realised your child has left something important behind? Don't panic! If you are able to bring it into school, please drop it into the wooden box in reception. If you can't make it back in, then any child who has forgotten packed lunch will be given a school dinner and if a child forgets their PE kit, we will loan them a spare set.

Any items left in reception should be clearly labelled with pupil name and class. Children who forget their musical instruments will still be sent to lessons as the teacher may have a spare.

School Uniform

All pupils are expected to wear full school uniform, including school shoes. No jewellery, other than a plain watch and small, plain ear studs may be worn. Jewellery, including earrings, must be removed before sports activities and therefore we recommend that it is not worn on PE and Games days. We ask that long hair is tied back at all times and excessive gel and hair adornments are saved for special occasions like the discos.
